

Lorence Hud, the Saskatoon native who now records with some success for A and M Records, is coming home for a performance. He will be the opening attraction when The Stampeders tour western Canada, which includes a July 2 stopover at the Saskatoon Arena.

Hud's latest album, Dancin' in My Head, has been a good seller and much of the success was traced to Lorence's alliance with producer Norbert Putman. Hud's first album had been a solo effort, playing all the instruments himself. With Putnam's assistance, the recording session became big league and, in fact, Lorence was surrounded by some of the top Nashville musicians like guitarist Reggie Young, drummer Kenny Buttrey and pianist David Briggs.

Putnam's credentials as a producer have been substantial, too, because he worked with Joan Baez, Buffy Ste. Marie, Eric Anderson and other pop groups.
